

Brief History

LibraryThing is an online bibliographic service to help people catalog and track their books easily. LibraryThing was developed by Tim Spalding and went live on August 29, 2005.

Scope and Coverage

LibraryThing offers powerful tools for cataloging and tracking books, music, & movies, with access to the Library of Congress, six national Amazon sites, and more than 1,000 libraries worldwide. LibraryThing had attracted more than 73,000 registered users who had cataloged 5.1 million individual books,

representing nearly 1.2 million unique works. In March 2008 they reached over 360,000 users and 24 million books.

Kind of Information

Under each particular entry includes details bibliographic information like title, author, other authors, ISBN, publication history, volume (if any), edition, paginations, primary language, summary etc. Each entry also includes cover page of the book. An example is given below through screen shot.
