Brief History

C-SPAN, which is a private, has pursued its mission to make government more open to the American public, televising political proceedings to millions of households across the country. Today it's a service available in 100 million American homes, and globally via the internet, providing round-the-clock access to public affairs and political events, U.S. government proceedings, international legislatures, as well as non-fiction book discussions and American history features. C-SPAN began with only four employees. Those four, Brian Lamb, Jana Dabrowski Fay, Don Houle, and Brian Lockman, transmitted the first television feed from the U.S. House of Representatives to C-SPAN viewers on March 19, 1979, the first day the House allowed television coverage of its floor debates.
