Brief History

Library of Satyajit Ray Film and Television Institute Calcutta was set up in 1997. The Library has been primarily designed to meet the requirements of the Institute's academic programmes.

Scope and Coverage

The library has been primarily designed to meet the requirements of the Institute’s academic programme. It has a collection of books and periodicals on cinema, Sociology, arts, history and critical studies along with specialized titles dealing with the technology of cinema. At present, the library has a great collection of DVDs ranging from classics to experimental. The collection includes 8292 books, 1233 journals, 2290 journals, 590 ACD, 283 VCD, 37 LD, 630 VHS cassettes. It also includes 138 CDs accompanying with books, 115 CDs accompanying with journals, 11 news papers.



Simple Search

In simple search option, users are able to choose one bibliographic field from the following top down menu and then have to put search term.




Advanced search



In advanced search option users can choose maximum three bibliographic fields and can put relevant search terms. The search results can be sorted by material types, media types, language, and location.

Authority Search



The above search processes produces a list of relevant documents with some bibliographic information like title of the document, author's name, place of publication, publisher, year or publication, physical descriptions, availability of copies of the document. The title in this list is hyperlinked with following more detailed bibliographic information:




The OPAC gives bibliographic information in general, MARC and ISBD view.

Arrangement Pattern

By default the listed documents are arranged by relevancy to the search queries. Users can arrange their desired documents in many ways, like according to popularity (most to least or least to most), author name (alphabetical from Z to A or from A to Z), call number (from 0 to 9 numbers to A to Z alphabets or vice versa), publication or copyright date from newest to oldest and vice versa, acquisition date from newest to oldest or vice versa, and lastly according to title from A to Z and vice versa.

Remarks

SRFTI is the premier institute of India for film training which stands in line with Film and Television Institute of India (FTII) for its quality of education and reputation in the Indian film industry and a member of CILECT (International Liaison Centre of Schools of Cinema and Television), an organization of the world's leading schools of film and television.
