Brief History


University of Chicago Library is the library system of the University of Chicago, located on the university's campus in Chicago, Illinois, United States. It is one of the largest university libraries in the United States. The library was founded by president of the University of Chicago, William Rainey Harper, who set the course for Special Collections as a “working collection” in 1891.

Scope and Coverage

The University of Chicago Library includes books (print and ebooks), video (DVDs, streaming, etc.), recordings (CDs, LPs, streaming, etc.), journals, magazines, and newspapers (print and online), music scores, dissertations, some databases and websites, library website, archives, manuscripts, images from the American Environmental Photographs Collection, the archival photographic files etc. The library holds 11.3 million volumes in print and electronic form, 62,300 archival and manuscript items, 153 terabytes of born-digital archives, digitized collections, and research data.

Kind of Information


The university library in its library web page provides basic and advanced catalog search options. In basic search option there is a search bar along with drop down menu where users are able to choose the required field from the following options:

Advanced Search

In advanced search process, the bibliographic fields can be added as requirement. The dropdown menu beside the search bar includes fields like title, author, performer, subject, call number, ISBN, ISSN, publisher, publication place, publication year, series etc.

The search queries can be limited by language, format, location, year of publication (the above screen shot shows it details).

The search process produces a list of documents. In this list limited bibliographic information mainly title of the work, author, physical description, subjects are provided. There is an option to save the item from list to the account. The titles are hyperlinked with another webpage with detailed bibliographic information like title of the work, author's or creator's name, edition, publication details, physical description, language of the work, subjects, format of the work, URL address for that particular record. With this bibliographical information the hyperlinked similar items are also provided.

Special Features

- The library webpage has links to Google Books, Articles Plus, JSTOR, ProQuest Dissertations & Theses, PubMed, Scopus, Web of Science, WorldCat, and Hathi Trust.
- There are also links to Chicago Manual of Style, Encyclopaedia Britannica Online, and Oxford English Dictionary.

Arrangement Pattern

The research result is arranged by relevancy to the search query given. But users can rearrange the list by publication date (ascending or descending), author name or title (alphabetical), call number (numeric or alphanumeric).

The University of Chicago Library has mission is to provide comprehensive resources and services in support of the research, teaching, and learning needs of the University community.
