This dictionary covers words on the following subjects like administration (e.g. ballot, bylaw, candidate etc.), birds (e.g. cock, crow, duck etc.), building materials (e.g. arch, bar, bolt etc.), crop and corn (e.g. oat, pea, pulse etc.), currencies (e.g. birr, dinar, dobra etc.), diseases (e.g. asthma, cancer, cold etc.), food and drink (e.g. cake, coffee, curd etc.), occupations (e.g. actor, astrologer, baker etc.) and so on.

- <u>Book of Common Prayer</u> (noun)
 - 1. the Anglican service book of the Church of England; has had several revisions since the Reformation and is widely admired for the dignity and beauty of its language

Used in phrasal verbs

- <u>book in</u> (phrasal verb)
 - 1. [transitive] to arrange for yourself or someone else to stay at a hotel, hospital etc
 - 2. [intransitive] to announce that you have arrived at a hotel or event so that your name can be put on an official record. You can also say check in, which is the usual American word
- <u>book on</u> (phrasal verb)
 - 1. book someone on something to buy tickets for someone for a specific journey on a plane, train, or bus

Links to Scrabble Dictionary and Scrabble Word Builder are available. Links to AL Software and AL Calculator are also incorporated.
Arrangement Pattern	Words are arranged alphabetically within alphabetically arranged list of subjects. For example, Administration, Animals and Beasts, Birds, Building Materials etc. are the subject categories arranged in alphabetic order. Within the subject "Building Materials" alphabetically arranged words are conspicuous by their presence like arch, bar, bolt, dust etc.
Remarks	It is an impressive and easy-to-use online dictionary. The subject wise browsing of words adds a special flavour to this dictionary in getting

	various terms on a particular subject under one roof. The multilingual translation facility of a term from English to other languages is a special bonus in learning foreign languages.
