## Brief History

### ***Scope and Coverage***

Webopedia's online computer dictionary offers definitions to tens of thousands of IT words and phrases to help one navigate the complex world of information technology.

### ***Kind of Information***

To describe Webopedia solely as a dictionary would mislead, as it has many useful additional features. Webopedia is an online tech dictionary for IT professionals, educators and students. It provides definitions to words, phrases and abbreviations related to computing and information technology. New terms are added on regular basis. Some of the terms which appear within the meaning of a particular term are cross-referenced. Related terms of a particular term are hyperlinked. Provision for downloading some articles on information technology is given below the meaning of terms. Some examples are given below for clear understanding. The term 'Zip drive' provides the following information:

#### **Zip drive**

A high-capacity floppy disk drive developed by Iomega Corporation. Zip disks are slightly larger than conventional floppy disks, and about twice as thick. They can hold 100 or 250 MB of data. Because they're relatively inexpensive and durable, they have become a popular media for backing up hard disks and for transporting large files.

#### **SAA**

Abbreviation of *System Application Architecture*, a set of architecture standards developed by IBM for program, user, and communications interfaces on various IBM platforms.

### ***Special Features***

- ❖ Links to various social networking sites like Facebook, Twitter, Google plus etc. and Blog are available.
- ❖ Term of the day, previous terms of the day, list of latest terms, list of popular tech terms etc. are also available.
- ❖ Link to Webopedia study guide is also found here.
- ❖ Quick reference index is present here. Webopedia has much supplementary information of an encyclopedic nature and this can be

found in the quick reference section.

- ❖ Latest articles on IT related issues are present.

**Arrangement Pattern** In the home page there is “Browse Terms” button. Clicking on which one can find A to Z arrangement of technical terms and some terms are also found under the numbers covering the range ‘0-9’. For example under the alphabet ‘A’ the terms like AAA, AAB, AAC, AAF etc. are arranged alphabetically. Under ‘8’ terms like 802.11a, 802.11ac , 802.11ac Wave 2 , 802.11ad etc. are arranged.

The terms are also arranged category wise. Both the categories and the terms under each category are arranged in alphabetic order. For example the category named ‘Multimedia’ covers the following sub categories like ‘Animation’, ‘Audio’, ‘Gaming’ etc. After clicking on particular sub category, one can find the terms under it. For example the sub category ‘Animation’ covers terms like ‘3-D software’, ‘Animator’, ‘Map’ etc.

**Remarks** This freely available online dictionary on computer and IT related terms is a great help for the students, researchers, teachers and the computer lovers of all round the globe.
