

## Brief History

**The Encyclopedia of Science Fiction** is an English language reference work on science fiction, first published in 1979.

This first edition, edited by Peter Nicholls with John Clute, was published by Granada. It was retitled *The Science Fiction Encyclopedia* when published by Doubleday in the United States. Accompanying its text were numerous black and white photographs illustrating authors, book and

magazine covers, film and TV stills, and examples of artists' work.

A second edition, jointly edited by Nicholls and Clute, was published in 1993 by Orbit in the UK and St. Martin's Press in the US. The second edition contained 1.3 million words, almost twice the 700,000 words of the 1979 edition.

The paperback edition included an addendum. Unlike the first edition, the print versions did not contain illustrations. There was also a CD-ROM version in 1995, styled variously as *The Multimedia Encyclopedia of Science Fiction* and *Grolier Science Fiction*. This contained text updates through 1995, hundreds of book covers and author photos, a small number of old film trailers, and author video clips taken from the TVOntario series *Prisoners of Gravity*.

The companion volume, published after the second print edition and following its format closely, is *The Encyclopedia of Fantasy* edited by John Clute and John Grant.

All print and CD-ROM editions are currently out of print.

In July 2011, Orion Publishing Group announced that the third edition of **the Science Fiction Encyclopedia** would be released online later that year by SFE Ltd in association with Victor Gollancz, Orion's science fiction imprint. The "beta text" of the third edition launched online on 2 October 2011, with editors John Clute, David Langford, Peter Nicholls (now Editor Emeritus) and Graham Sleight. The encyclopedia is updated regularly (usually several times a week) by the editorial team with material written by themselves and contributed by science fiction academics and experts.

### *Scope and Coverage*

The encyclopedia provides entries under following categorical division and subdivision.

#### ➤ **Authors**

- ✓ **Art** (This category contains entries for artists and other topics related to sf art).
- ✓ **Author** (This category contains entries for sf authors).
- ✓ **Editor** (This category contains entries for editors in the sf field).
- ✓ **People** (This category contains entries for people who are notable in sf media: film- and TV-makers are tagged as People to distinguish them from productions).
- ✓ **Critic** (This category contains entries for critics, reviewers, and academics of importance to sf).
- ✓ **House name** (This category contains entries for "house names" - that is, pseudonyms owned by a publisher and used by one or more authors).

- **Themes**
  - ✓ **Theme** (This category contains entries for themes, motifs, and terminology).
- **Media**
  - ✓ **Game** (This category contains entries for sf-related games and game designers).
  - ✓ **Film** (This category contains entries for sf movies and movie-makers).
  - ✓ **TV** (This category contains entries for sf tv series and people associated to sf tv).
  - ✓ **Comics** (This category contains entries for sf comics and graphic novels, and their creators).
  - ✓ **Music** (This category contains entries for sf-related music and its creators).
  - ✓ **Character** (This category contains entries for characters who have appeared in sf-related media).
  - ✓ **Radio** (This category contains entries for sf radio programmes and their creators).
- **Culture**
  - ✓ **Publication** (This category contains entries for sf magazines and fanzines, including online magazines).
  - ✓ **Community** (This category is for entries related to the larger sf community, such as conventions, organizations, and publishers).
  - ✓ **Fan** (This category is for entries about sf fandom, fanzines, and fanzine producers).
  - ✓ **Award** (This category is for entries about awards in the sf field).
  - ✓ **International** (This category is for entries about sf across the world).

[Note: Here sf means science fiction.]

The online edition of *The Encyclopedia of Science Fiction* was released in October 2011 with 12,230 entries, totaling 3,200,000 words. It contained 4,000,000 words in January 2013. As of the latest update to this page on 25 August 2016, the encyclopedia contains 16,760 entries totaling 5,215,996 words. There are 186,283 internal hyperlinks between entries, corresponding to cross-references in past book editions.

## ***Kind of Information***

The articles in this encyclopedia give a provision to know about the various topics of science fictions.

### **Example from “Authors” category**

The article under the category author, named “Adeler, Max” gives following kind of information:

- ❖ Brief description about the author including his works;
- ❖ Gives one see also reference “[Shared Worlds](#)”;
- ❖ Under his pseudonym “Charles Heber Clark”, the article includes the date and the place of the birth and death of the author;
- ❖ Chronological and alphabetical checklist of author’s works. The following screen shot displays the chronological list of 10 works of this author:

### **Example from “Theme” category**

The article “Aliens” is under the “Theme” category. This entry gives following kinds of information.

- ❖ Publication date of the article, i.e., April 23, 2016;
- ❖ The category name, i.e., Theme;
- ❖ The sharing options, like “Print”, “Tweet”, “Share”, “Email”, “Google +”;
- ❖ Links to previous and next 858 number of articles from the alphabetic list of articles under Theme category. Under “Incoming” option, the encyclopedia provides an alphabetic list of cross referenced articles from various categories along with Theme category;
- ❖ This article gives a comprehensive description on the topic “aliens” and includes many hyperlinked words in the article which are connected to the related articles of the encyclopedia;
- ❖ Within the text of the article, the encyclopedia provides links of see references articles;
- ❖ Further reading list;
- ❖ Two see also references, like Music and SF Music;
- ❖ 24 Previous versions of this articles;
- ❖ At the top right hand side of the article there is a list of recently viewed articles.

### *Special Features*

- This encyclopedia is connected with Twitter, Facebook. User can also give feedback to the SFE editors.
