**Kind of Information**

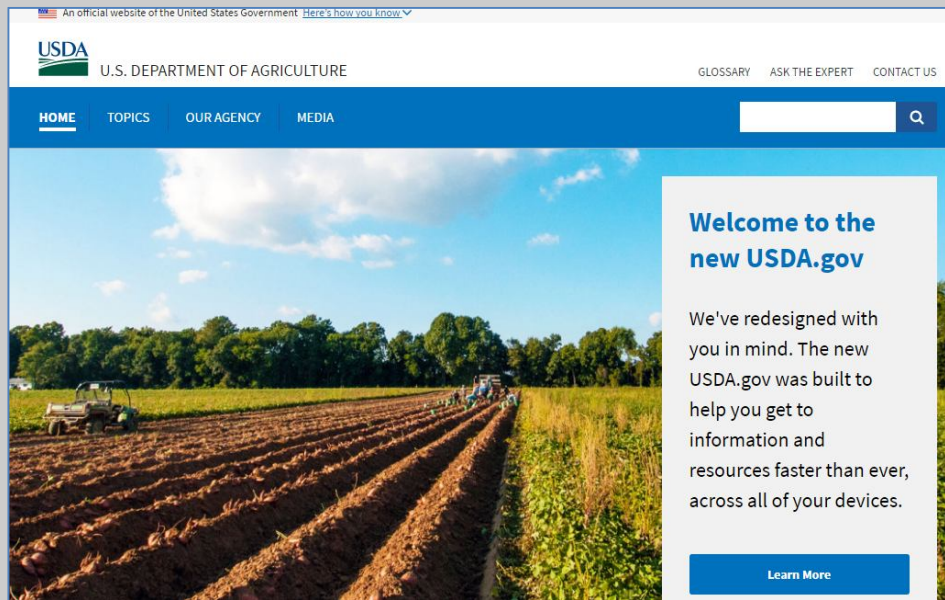
