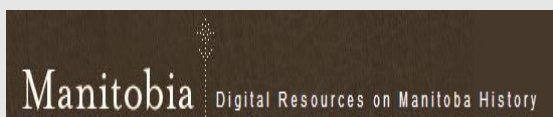

## Scope and Coverage

Most of the newspapers are covered from Canada, and most these titles are available from 1850s.

## Kind of Information

Digital collection of the Manitoba Library Consortium includes many early newspapers published in Manitoba from the earliest published title (1859) to approximately 1920. Also includes The Winnipeg Tribune from 1939-1945. Browseable by date, with article zooming. Formerly known as Manitoba: Life and Times.

It provides all the available newspapers with full page view.

### Brandon Sun Weekly

January 19, 1882 - July 1, 1897

## LAND REGULATION

To the Editor of the SUN,

UNDER DATE of 24th inst. "Public Opinion" writes you in reference to the land regulations--which he and others designate "Fashion plate"--complaining that sufficient notice is not given of the changes contemplated by the Government and that immigrants are deceived in consequence, and that homestead and pre-emption entries of bona-fide settlers are placed in jeopardy during a temporary absence and liable to be cancelled without the knowledge of the homesteaders, or any means allowing them of defence.

Mr. P.O. aims a blow at Sir John A. Macdonald for not redeeming certain pledges and expresses astonishment and dismay at the manner in which 'his mischievous' Messrs.

## Arrangement Pattern

Newspaper titles are arranged alphabetically

### Brandon Daily Sun

January 1, 1882 - December 31, 1960

The Brandon Daily Sun began publication in 1882 and appeared until 1884 when it was replaced by the Brandon Weekly Sun. In 1897, the Daily Sun reappeared and soon became the newspaper of record for Brandon and south western Manitoba, until it was succeeded by the Brandon Sun in 1960.

### Courrier du Nord-Ouest

May 31, 1888 - December 27, 1888

This short-lived weekly newspaper (May to December 1888) was founded in St. Boniface by James Prendergast, Provincial Secretary in the newly-formed Liberal government under Thomas Greenway. The editor was former M.P. for Ste. Agathe, Ernest Cyr. Its publication was in response to a need for a French language political newspaper for the provincial Liberal party. The newspaper could not gain the support of the staunchly Conservative population of St. Boniface, and disappeared following Cyr's defeat in the provincial election in June 1888.

### Daily Nor'Wester

February 3, 1894 - June 8, 1898

The Daily Nor'Wester was published six times a week (except Sundays) from February 3, 1894 to June 8, 1898. Prospectus Dec. 29, 1893. It was started by W.F. Luxton, the founder of the Manitoba Free Press. Luxton sold the Daily Nor'Wester in 1896 and under new ownership, morning and evening editions were published from January 2, 1897 to June 8, 1898. It was continued as the Morning Telegram on June 9, 1898.

## Remarks

It is an important source for the researchers and historians who want to study about Manitoba, Canada.
