Brief History

The American Historical Association (AHA) was founded in 1884 and chartered by Congress in 1889 to serve the interests of the entire discipline of history. Aligning with the AHA's mission, the *AHR* has been the journal of record for the historical profession

in the United States since 1895—the only journal that brings together scholarship from every major field of historical study. The journal also publishes approximately one thousand book reviews per year, surveying and reporting the most important contemporary historical scholarship in the discipline.

It was established as a joint effort between the history department at Cornell University and its counterpart at Harvard, modeled on The English Historical Review and the French *Revue historique*, "for the promotion of historical studies, the collection and preservation of historical documents and artifacts, and the dissemination of historical research."

### ***Scope and Coverage***

The American Historical Review is the official publication of the American Historical Association. It targets readers interested in all periods and facets of history. It is widely regarded as the premier journal of American history in the world, and is also highly respected as a general historical journal.

The journal is published in February, April, June, October and December as a book-like academic publication with research papers and book reviews, among other items (each issue typically runs to about 400 pages). Each year approximately 25 articles and review essays and 1,000 book reviews are published.

The editorial offices are located at Indiana University Bloomington, where a small staff produces the publication under the guidance of a 12-member advisory board. From the October 2007 issue until 2011, the journal was published by the University of Chicago Press. In September 2011, it was announced that the journal would be published by Oxford University Press, beginning in 2012.

### ***Kind of Information***

The American Historical Review is presented as a container of history especially American history. The content of the journal deals with an introduction part i.e. what is presented in that issue, information about back issues, AHR Forum, AHR Roundtable, AHR Conversation, Featured Reviews, Reviews of Books, Comparative / World / Transnational, information about continents etc. All the information can be Extract. Full text in HTML format can be viewed. Full text in pdf format can be downloaded after subscription. Even permissions for subscription, is given through RightsLink. Most read and most cited articles are presented in a list of tables to guide the visitors. There is some subscription policies presented as a guide to prices.
