

Brief History

The ONS was formed on 1 April 1996 by the merger of the Central Statistical Office (CSO) and the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys (OPCS).

Scope and Coverage

It covers information on the activities of businesses and industry in the UK, including data on the production and trade of goods and services, sales by retailers, characteristics of businesses, the construction and manufacturing sectors, and international trade. Employment data covering employment rates, hours of work and earnings. It also gives information on neighbourhood statistics (NeSS) which offers free access to a summary of your neighbourhood and small area data. This covers the census, deprivation, health, local economy, education, housing and crime. It allows to analyse and compare selected areas using maps and charts.

Kind of Information

UK business dataset contains data on local units and enterprises by geography, industry, legal status and employment size band. There are additional data at enterprise level by turnover size band.

Dataset can be seen by selecting entity type, time period and a mandatory field. Data can be seen in tabular format including graphical representation also. Examples are given below:

It also provides information on careers including the facilities and scope. Information on different topics are given with their macro categories and related articles.

The efficiency of the UK workforce calculated as output per worker, output per job and output per hour. It gives information on labour productivity which is an important factor in determining the productive potential of the economy and the relevant statistical representation are given as highlights as follows:



It provides information on people, population and community. It includes information births, deaths, marriage, crime and justice, culture and identity, education and health, housing, elections, population and migration etc. The national accounts framework brings units and transactions together to provide a simple and understandable description of production, income, consumption, accumulation and wealth.

Its publications are also discussed here with brief description. As for e.g. : the annual United Kingdom national accounts are published in an online publication (The Blue Book) by ONS. It records and describes economic activity in the United Kingdom and as such is used by government, banks, academics and industries to formulate the economic and social policies and monitor the economic progress of the United Kingdom. It also allows international comparisons to be made.

- Visitors can search the website by using keyword or time series id.
- Datasets can be changed, refined and downloaded.
- Statistical bulletin can be printed directly.
