Within the "Short paper" segment the article, "In Search of Animal Intelligence: The Case of the Italian Psychologist Tito Vignoli (1824-1914)" by Elena Canadelli, explores investigation of Italian anthropologist and comparative psychologist Tito Vignoli (1824-1914) into the hidden inner world of the animal psyche. Vignoli's investigation was significant in the fact that he was one of the first Italian scientist to adopt Darwinian theory of evolution and applied simple experiments and observations in his probe of animal intelligence.

The highlights of this yearbook are its special attention to the common areas between psychological research and its nearby disciplines, absence of bias while each national research tradition is analysed and respected. A review section is contained in the yearbook.
